

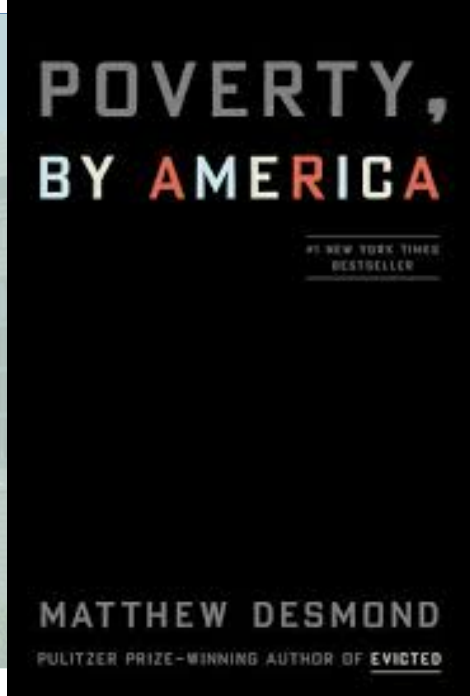

BOOK REVIEW

Poverty, By America

Desmond offers a unique perspective into why poverty in America is so rampant. He talks about programs created in the last century in the United States that were put in place to fight poverty and how they are failing because of systemic racism and classicism. It's a difficult topic to read about, and an extremely challenging problem to fix. There has to be a lot of political will to make forward progress on such issues, but often those with that will are not in a place of power when the topics are being discussed. This is a good book to make you think, but you may also feel a fair amount of frustration.
